Employees will learn about potential inhalation hazards, the different respirator types and their uses, how to fit test a respirator mask, and respirator care and maintenance. This course is intended to assist the employer in meeting OSHA Standard 29 CFR 1910.134, Respiratory Protection. Workplace specific information and hands-on training will need to be provided by the employer.
